

Darling Downs-Moreton Rabbit Board

Publication Scheme as provided for in the *Right to Information Act 2009*

1. DDMRB is a statutory authority established under the *Biosecurity Act 2014* (the Act). DDMRB's functions under the Act are: to keep the rabbit barrier fence in good order, and to ensure it is maintained as an effective barrier against rabbits; and, to manage rabbits in the DDMRB operational area.
2. DDMRB's structure is shown on the organisational chart shown at Figure 1.
3. Under the Act, all managers of land have a *general biosecurity obligation* to control rabbits where they exist on land under their control. DDMRB assists land managers in the DDMRB operational area meet those obligations through provision of advice on best practice control measures. Failure of land managers to meet their *general biosecurity obligation* may lead to enforcement action being taken by DDMRB under the Act.
